Next meeting: October 11th, 7:00 PM, Merrick Art Gallery Oil Painting in a Realist Style

As a child in Pittsburgh, **Robert Huckestein** dreamed of being an artist. But for practical reasons, he became an engineer instead. During his 35-year engineering career, Robert continued drawing, painting, and studying art history in his spare time. He took painting workshops and visited galleries and museums around the world. Today, Robert lives his dream of being a full-time artist.

After experimenting with many different styles of art from abstract to photorealism, Robert returned to drawing and painting in the realistic style for which his work is now recognized. He has


developed his style based on bright colors, realism, and a strong composition that he translates into a strong and moving work of art. His work *begins with an emotional connection* to whatever he has chosen to paint or draw. His subject matter includes architecture, people in the environment, portraits, landscapes, and still lifes. His media are primarily oil for painting and graphite for his drawings.

Robert has received awards in national and regional shows, and his work is included in private and corporate collections and in the State Museum of Pennsylvania's permanent collection. For more information, see www.roberthuckestein.com.
