Beaver Valley Artists upcoming schedule

Here are some updates on our current plans for meeting, assuming the state guidelines will allow it then: We won't meet in February. We will plan to meet on March 11th, the second Thursday of the month. This March meeting will include a Group Critique. Then, we will most likely meet in April. We are hoping to have a program or presentation set up for April.

Our annual show is scheduled from Sunday, April 25th thru Thursday, May 13th. May 13th is also our meeting, and we plan the Juror Critique for that meeting. We haven't set the drop off dates for our art, but they will be some time in April.

The show opening will be on April 25th. There will probably still be limits on how many people can be in the gallery at one time. The weather should be warm enough that we can use the veranda and garden areas to accommodate people. The recent Merrick Masters Exhibition showed us how this could be done.

There will be an option to move our show to summer, but for now, we are going ahead with plans for April.


As soon as we know more, we will let you know. Your membership dues from last year will carry over through this year. Please feel free to contact me with any questions or ideas.

Hello all! I have been participating in a fun artist challenge called Inktober and I would like to encourage you all to join in! I spend about an hour each day doing an ink drawing and then I post it to the Inktober social media pages. I have shared some of my ink drawings here as examples.

Jake Parker created Inktober in 2009 as a challenge to improve his inking skills and develop positive drawing habits. It has since grown into a worldwide endeavor with thousands of artists taking on the challenge every year.

There are two ways to Participate:

- 1. Inktober Classic 31 days 31 drawings
- 2. Inktober 52 One drawing a week all year long

Inktober rules:

- 1) Make a drawing in ink (you can do a pencil under-drawing if you want). There are also prompt lists available if you need some inspiration.
- 2) Post it*
- 3) Hashtag it with #inktober and #inktober2020
- 4) Repeat

Note: you can do it daily, or go the half-marathon route and post every other day, or just do the 5K and post once a week. What ever you decide, just be consistent with it. Inktober is about growing and improving and forming positive habits, so the more you're consistent the better.

That's it! Now go make something beautiful.

*Post it on any social media account you want or just post it on your refrigerator. The point is to share your art with someone. :)
