I was born and raised in Racine, Wisconsin, located on the western shores of Lake Michigan. Most of my childhood was pretty normal, except that I don't remember a time without art... specifically drawing. It wasn't until I became an adult that I was exposed to pottery, my chosen art medium, and then pursued a college education. In 1982, I graduated cum laude with a double degree in Fine Art and Education.

Teaching jobs were scarce then, so through friends, I entered the commercial art field,



designing ads for an exclusive women's department store in downtown Chicago, followed by a job designing catalogs, including dealing with printers for a company that drop-shipped athletic equipment. Lastly, in Wisconsin, I supervised the in-house printing department for the YMCA of Metropolitan Milwaukee. In 1991 I move to Pennsylvania and with Gabe, my husband, started a small "Desktop Publishing" company called Bristol Ridge Publishing. Together we produced newsletters, flyers, websites and other advertising for many of the municipalities, courthouse, and political parties in Beaver County.



Little did I know, the first time I walked into a 1997 BVA meeting, that I would begin a 22 year friendship with BVA and the Merrick Art Gallery. I served as president of BVA from 2005 - 2007, and began teaching children's art and pottery for the Merrick in 1999, retiring from that a few years ago. In 2008, I became the Administrative Assistant at the Merrick and will retire from that position December 1 of this year.

In December when I move to Florida to be closer to my children, I will take wonderful memories of the friends and fellow artists that I have known here. I will remember our laughter, how we encouraged each other, and how we shared our love of art in any form it took.
